


Join the fun July 16th at Montana Hanna's

SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

This year the Nye Community Foundation awarded our scholarships to local students. Three of the scholarships are for \$800 each, with two of them provided entirely by the foundation. The third was provided jointly by the foundation and donations at David Butler's Monday Night Football suppers at Carter's Camp in Nye. Two \$800-scholarships were awarded to this year's graduates of Absarokee High School, and the other was given to a student attending an institution of higher learning. The \$1,000-scholarship was donated by Friends of the Foundation and awarded to a 2005 graduate of Absarokee High School.



Whitney DeVilbiss, the daughter of Alex and Geri DeVilbiss of Absarokee, received the \$1,000-scholarship provided by Friends of the Nye Community Foundation. She has been accepted at the Montana State University College of Technology in Billings, and wants to work for the American Medical Response and Big Sky Emergency Medical Service (EMS). Her goals are to be an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and paramedic, and ultimately to be a flight nurse. In high school she was in the local and district FFA, the National Honor Society, and high school pep and concert bands, receiving a superior rating for flute solos at the district music festival for two years. She is certified in basic first aid, cardiac pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED). She has been enrolled in EMT basic training through the EMS in Laurel since January. She was a teacher's aide in the Vo-Ag program in high school and helped with the flower planting on the streets of Absarokee.



Rachelle Jensen, daughter of Phil and Patti Jensen of Absarokee, received an \$800-scholarship and plans to attend the University of Wyoming and then Colorado State University for training as a veterinarian. She wants to major in microbiology with a minor in molecular biology and work in the field of veterinary research. In high school she was active in 4-H and the local and national FFA, serving as FFA president her senior year.

In her senior year, she was also president of the National Honor Society and the Absarokee High School student council. Her community service included helping at blood drives, Christmas parties at the Homestead Retirement Home, assisting at the Jim Annin Leadership Camp and the Beartooth Mountain Christian Ranch Carnival. For five years she worked part-time at the Stillwater Veterinary Clinic.
